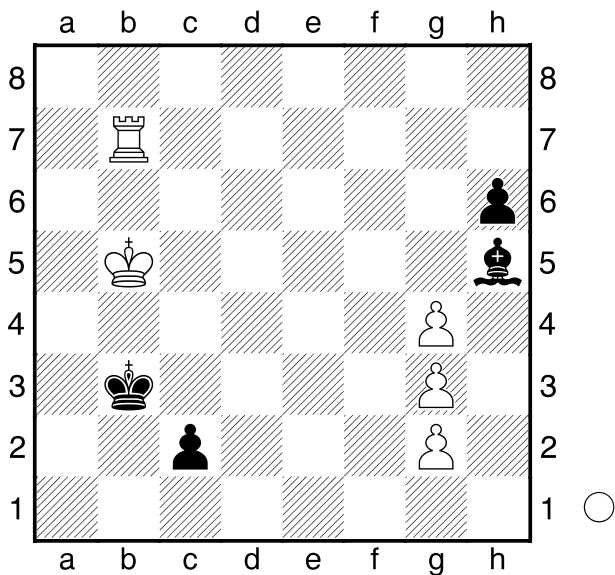

- 1.Ka6+!** [1 point]  
 [ 1.Kc5+? Kc3 2.Rb4 Bf7 ]  
**1...Ka3** /a2/a4 **2.Rc7 Bg6 3.Kb7** [+0.5=1.5 points] **3...Kb3!**  
 [ or exchange of moves 3...Bd3! 4.Kc8 Kb3 ]  
**4.Kc8 Bd3!**  
 [ 4...Bf7? 5.Rb7+ Kc3?? 6.Rxf7 and white would even win ]  
**5.Rxc2** [+0.5=2 points] **5...Kxc2** This is Wotawa's starting position (Deutsche Schachzeitung 1939) with a small difference (bBSd3→e2). **6.Kd7**  
 [ 6.Kd8 Be2 7.g5 hxg5 8.g4 Kd3 ]  
**6...Be2 7.g5** [+1=3 points] **7...hxg5 8.g4** [+1=4 points]  
**8...Bxg4+ 9.Ke7 Be2** or elsewhere **10.g4** [+1=5 points]  
**10...Bxg4 11.Kf6**

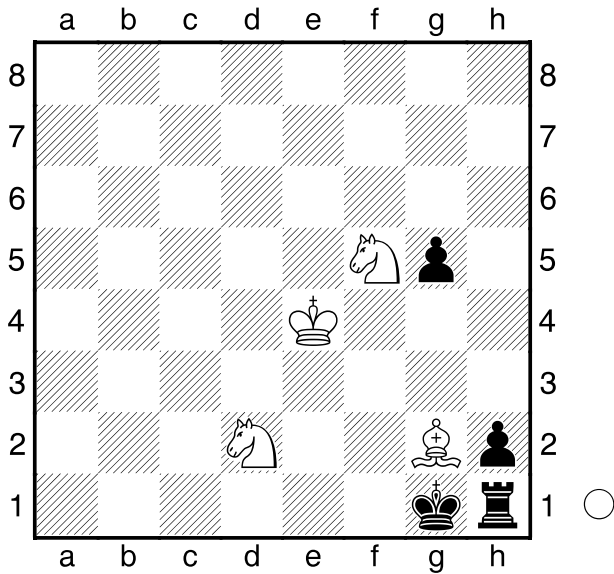

**1...g4!** The Black king must guard his rook. **2.Ke3!**

[ 2.Nh4? Kf2! 3.Bxh1 Kg1= ]

**2...gxf3**

[ 2...g3 např. 3.Nd4 g2 4.Ne2# ]

**3.Nh4** Fritz's original study (1st . hm New Statesman 1973) reached this position after the move 7.Nb1-d2. Unfortunately, his study was cooked **3...f2**

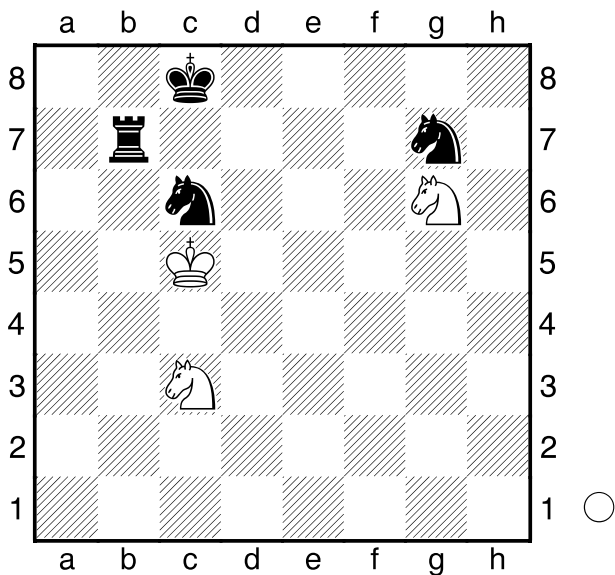
